
Wellbeing in Action at SC

- This year we are focusing on Character Strengths.
- Character strengths are the positive qualities individuals have as reflected in their thoughts, feelings, and actions, that promote the wellbeing of themselves and others.
- Why focus on Character Strengths? People who focus on their strengths are more confident, have higher levels of energy and vitality. They are also more resilient, perform better at work and are more likely to achieve their goals. When focusing on our strengths our body language naturally reflects this.





Modes of Communication in 2023

Santa Clara School Seesaw Protocols

Purpose of Seesaw

Seesaw is used at Santa Clara School as a tool to enhance communication between school and home. It allows for streamlined communication of class level notices and the sharing and showcasing of student learning.

Protocols for Seesaw

- 1. Teachers use Seesaw's Announcements tab to communicate classroom information to parents/caregivers.
- 2. Teachers and parents/caregivers will use Seesaw or email to contact each other about child specific information.
- 3. Please 'like' your child's journal entries freely.
- 4. Work samples and photos that contain your child may be shared freely as you wish. However, parents/caregivers are not to share photos or videos that contain other students in the class as this is a breach of the school's Privacy Policy and Code of Conduct. Whole class or group photos must not be downloaded and shared with others. We ask that you please respect the privacy of other students in the class.



Hair longer than shoulder length, which is past the eyes, ears or collar are required to tie it up or pin it back.

Punctuality & Absences

ARRIVE LATE

Arriving at school after 8.45am (or 8.50am for Kindy)?

Arrival time after 8:45 am requires a parent or guardian to sign in at the office.

The student then takes a late slip to their class teacher.

LEAVE EARLY

Leaving school before 3:00pm (or 2.45pm for Kindy)?

Parent signs the student out at the office.

Hand the slip to the teacher when collecting your child.

Or hand the slip to the duty teacher when collecting during break times.

ABSENT

Sick or unable to attend school?

Inform the school of your child's absence by 9:15am by email including the date and reason they are away.

PUNCTUALITY

Arrive at least ten minutes before the bell to prepare for the day.

Your classroom teacher is responsible for making sure you are safe, happy and learning at school, You can always talk to them.

OTHER STAFF YOU GET ALONG WITH



Sometimes you may not want to talk to your class teacher. Find a member of your trusted network or another staff member you trust and talk to them.

ASSISTANT PRINCIPALS



Mrs Grech & Mr Gaudion are always around if you need to talk to someone. They love listening to what kids have to say and can offer help.

PRINCIPAL



Mr Payne is in charge of everything that happens at Santa Clara, so he is always happy to talk to you about any problems you have.



Behaviour Management

RESTORATIVE APPROACH

Restorative Practices assist teachers, students and parents to build, maintain and restore relationships.

Restorative Practices will help build capacity to enable students to self-regulate behaviour and contribute to the improvement of learning outcomes.





Behaviour Management

The full procedure is available on our school website under Documents.



First occasion: Reminder of appropriate behaviour, Verbal Warning (Warning).



Second occasion: Reminder of appropriate behaviour, Second Verbal Warning (Rethink).



Third occasion: Reminder of appropriate behaviour, Verbal Warning and Reflection Time, involving Think Sheet. Student moves to a reflection space and is given time to reflect on their behaviour (Reflect). Student re-joins the class.

Support Program

Santa Clara School delivers a differentiated curriculum in all year levels and recognises the diverse needs of all students.

Support Programs are also available to a select group of students who may require extra assistance. At the commencement of each school year a range of assessments are conducted in both literacy and mathematics and the results are used to determine if a student is best placed in a small group intervention program.

MultiLit Program: Literacy support through specific phonemic instruction as well as opportunities to develop fluency and comprehension skills when reading.

MultiLit aims to fast-track student learning through focussed, intensive intervention – so students not only achieve success but also increase their self-esteem and confidence.





Academic Extension - SCiTEAM

Academic Extension at Santa Clara School is offered in the following ways:

Kindy to Year 2

In class extension through quality differentiated teaching practice. Our SCiTEAM Teacher and Pedagogical Practice Coach also work closely with staff providing enrichment to meet the educational needs of all students.

Digital Technology

Students in Years 4 to 6 participate in a 1:1 iPad program funded by an iPad levy detailed on your school fees.

STEM - Makerspace

All students will be immersed in the Makerspace throughout the year in our STEM program.

To develop students coding skills, we have a variety of robotics including Ozobots, Spheros and Beebots and Lego Mindstorm. We also have a green screen and 3D printers.




