Throughout 2023, our school community continues to grow in building strong foundations in faith, wisdom, and peace. These three things enable us to find our connection and grounding in this special community. There is no doubt that the words of Saint Clare, our patroness, continue to set the foundation for who we are as a community. 


One of things I have realised through all my learnings this year, is that when we are in conversations, or preparing for a meeting about school or a child's learning, or whether it be a family situation, we can tend to over prepare for it. We think we are being diligent, getting everything organised, thinking of what may be asked, having all the answers, predicting what the other person may say. But this only adds pressure to the conversations and does not allow for true listening. I am guilty of this in all aspects of my life. I can prepare for a staff meeting, even family stuff, and think about it way too much rather than go with the flow and simply listen.

Through listening, we 100% discover story, and once we are aware of another's story, we can listen with true understanding. I have failed at this a number of times, trying to have all the answers, but this year I have taken time to reflect and think about how I could have handled situations differently. However, God speaks to us in the everyday events of life. When I was flat and tired one day out on duty, I was reminded by Hayden in Year One, that it's OK. This wise Year One student reminded me that when I mess up or feel flat, that in fact it is OK. It means I get another chance in my next conversation.



When we overthink, or do all the talking and dominate a conversation, feel the need to give advice, continually thinking of our next response, then it is hard to listen with empathy and understanding. It is a wonderful challenge to place on us to not always have an answer. We are far more engaged with each other if we keep high respect for the other and come with a willingness to listen. This creates an openness and safety in dialogue leading to the response or next step. I think what I have loved most about my learnings this year and what stands out the most is a quote that I constantly reflect on, 'No one cares how much you know until they know how much you care'. This is something that is truly lived out in our community.



The ability to truly listen and not already having the answers is something that will be a focus for next year. We are reminded that when we listen, we will also find God's voice. This quote is so true. Listening to His voice in all our conversations will also bring a sense of calmness to our days. I think with all the noise, and all the pressure that comes with being in a school in today's world, maybe this is the way to bring a sense of peace to the chaos we all experience. In the end, this is all about being in the present with others, something I feel we all try to do our best we can when we have the capacity and energy.

Inspiring Christ-Centred Leaders (Catholic Identity)

Religious Education and faith formation are the primary purpose of Catholic schools. In partnership with all parents, the school and parish work together to assist the children to develop knowledge of their Catholic faith. The explicit teaching of Catholic practices and knowledge, through the Religious Education Units of Work, is an integral part of our mission as a school. It is mandated by the Bishops of Western Australia and the Catholic Education Commission of Western Australia from which our lessons are planned.

Throughout the year, our Santa Clara students have supported a number of charities including Project Compassion and Catholic Missions. During our St Clare Feast Day celebrations, we were able to raise \$1300 for the Archbishop's Lifelink Appeal. We will also be soon having our annual Christmas Appeal for our St Vincent De Paul Chapter here in St James. We would like to thank our staff and students for their engagement in these initiatives. Our calling to serve has ensured we have once again improved the lives of those vulnerable in our community. I thank the students, staff and parent body for impacting the lives of others.

Again, in 2023, our Sacramental Program of Reconciliation, Eucharist and Confirmation were celebrated with our Parish family. The workshops and celebrations were meaningful and connected our children to Jesus and



the broader community. We thank all staff and parents for their engagement in creating Liturgies that were celebrations of joy.

Our staff continue to work towards completion of Accreditation requirements as part of working in a Catholic school and their individual faith journey. Their efforts and commitment is very much appreciated.

Catholic Schools of Excellence (Education)

We have very experienced and passionate staff members at Santa Clara School, who go about ensuring high standards of teaching and learning for our students. This, along with coaching from Renae Armstrong, our Pedagogical Practice Coach, has positively impacted our confidence as teachers and the standards of our students across all year levels. This ensures our Vision for Learning and agreed upon teaching pedagogy is consistent across all year levels. The real impact of the improved use of data in our school is reflected in the growth of our students and the magnified impact that a teacher has in class. I am so proud of the efforts of all our staff and the high caliber of teaching and learning programs they implement for their students.

2023 NAPLAN assessments took place in Term One this year. Our Year 3 and 5 students once again tackled the week of assessments with confidence. At Santa Clara, we continue to teach our students concepts as part of our learning programs, preparing them for the testing style they will experience during NAPLAN. Reducing any anxiety attached to the testing experience only goes to improving the opportunity for our students to showcase their full potential, which is all we ask of them. Our school once again performed well, and we celebrated the fact that our students, many of whom come from non-English speaking backgrounds, are not only mastering Australian Standard English, they ensured our school average Proficiency Band aligned with the National and State average. These results are the product of our staff and students and drive us forward in 2024.

Accessible, Affordable and Sustainable System of Schools (Stewardship)

Enrolments at our school have continued to increase this year. In fact, this year we reached 224 students, the highest number we have seen in over ten years at our school, meaning our school is currently sitting at 90% capacity. Strong enrolment trends are associated with our reputation in the local and surrounding areas. This connection with our community is ever present and is a result of the work of our staff, students and their families. This positive feel in the community is driven by the stories of our families and the quality of our teaching and learning programs embedded at the school. To ensure this trend continues, we must ensure we provide the best for our students and remain open to opportunities of growth.
