
#### **ASH WEDNESDAY MASS**


Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Season of Lent. It is a season of penance, reflection, and fasting which prepares us for Christ's Resurrection on Easter Sunday, through which we attain redemption. The Ash Wednesday Mass will be celebrated on Wednesday 5 February 2014 at the Santa Clara Parish, commencing at 9:00am. Father Armando will be presenting the Mass. Thank you to Ms Temmen and the Year Five students for assisting with the organisation of the Mass.

#### **WHAT IS LENT?**

The season of Lent is a Catholic liturgical season consisting of forty days of fasting, prayer, and penitence beginning at <a href="Ash Wednesday">Ash Wednesday</a> and concluding at sundown on Holy Thursday.

The official liturgical colour for the season of Lent is violet. The observance of Lent is related to the celebration of Easter. Many Catholics were taught as children to "give up something" for Lent. Throughout history, Catholics have found prayer, fasting, and almsgiving to be an important part of repentance and renewal.

#### MARISTELY FROM BRAZIL

Maristely, 18, lives in a Favela (slum) in Sao Paulo, Brazil with her family. Favela life is difficult. Dark and cramped, they often built on land affected by floods and landslides; there is also high unemployment, dense population and widespread violence. Caritas Australia's partner, the Movement for the Defence of Favela Residents (MDF), is changing lives across 40 Favelas by enabling people to advocate for their rights to be upheld.

Thousands of families now have access to clean water, electricity and connected sewerage, and deeds to their land. MDF also offers a youth leadership program so young people can attain education and employment, rather than joining local gangs. Those improved living conditions means Maristely and her family are now enjoying a full life and are proud of where they live.

As John 10:10 states, 'I (Jesus) have come in order that you might have life – life in all its fullness.'

Week three already and school routines are firmly established and both new and returning students are into the swing of the school year. Our new starting time is working very smoothly.

**PARENT INFORMATION EVENING:** On Tuesday evening there was a great show of parents supporting students and teachers. Mr Win Pe reminded everyone of our Christian mission of making Jesus present in our lives. In week nine of this term, 1 April, individual parent interviews will be conducted between 12:30pm and 5:00pm. Students will be dismissed at 12:00noon on this day. If you need to discuss your child's individual needs prior to this time please make an appointment to see the classroom teacher.

**AFTER SCHOOL PICK-UP:** To keep our children safe we have asked children to be seated in family groups in the pick-up area. Children are asked to proceed to the pick-up area quickly after dismissal and to remain seated with siblings until parents or guardians arrive. Duty teachers will direct children to cars. This will ensure everyone is safe and pick-up runs smoothly. Thanks for your support in this.

**CYBER-SAFETY:** Cyer-safety and awareness is an essential part of keeping our children safe in this technological age. Later this year student, staff and parent education workshops will be conducted by "Cybersmart" W.A. Please pencil 26 August into your diaries for this very important event. MATHS NEWS: This week Mathletics log-ins were updated for students and teachers. Mathletics is a wonderful tool to encourage and support children in their maths progress, children can access age appropriate activities and games from home. Mathletics can be accessed from desk-tops, lap-tops and iPads. At Santa Clara School we are focusing on a maths curriculum to provide children with the skills and vocabulary necessary to be proficient in maths, particularly problem solving. We would like to raise the profile of mathematics and encourage parents to engage in discussions and activities to help children see maths in a positive light.

### A Note from the Community Health Nurse

Welcome to the new school year. My name is Fiona Ewing and I am the Community Health Nurse who visits your school.

Community Health Nurses work in schools to promote healthy development and wellbeing so students may reach their full potential. A major part of my work is focused on early intervention and the School Entry Health Assessment program.

Community Health Nurses serve as a health contact point for children and their families, providing information, assessment, health counselling and referral. The services provided are free and confidential.

If you have a concern about your child's health or development, please contact me on 9313 5418.

#### **Immunisation Reminder**

Maintaining a high level of immunisation within our community is very important to controlling many communicable diseases.

It is important for parents to make sure that their children have received all of the childhood vaccinations. This includes Measles, Mumps, Rubella, Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis (whooping cough), and polio vaccines before school entry or from three and a half years of age. If you are unsure, phone 1800 653 809.

If you child has missed out on vaccinations, a doctor or immunisation nurse can provide 'catch-up' vaccinations.

Make an appointment with a GP or visit the local (free) immunisation clinic (medicare card required) provided by:

- Child & Adolescent Health ph 6151 1308 OR
- Central Immunisation Clinic, Rheola St, West Perth ph 9321 1312

Parents or legal guardians who do not immunise their child should note the following:

In the case of a Measles or Pertussis (whooping cough) outbreak, Western Australian schools are required by the Department of Health, to exclude students who have not received the appropriate vaccination.

Please make sure your school-aged child is fully immunised and that you have provided a copy of the ACIR immunisation record to the school.

Did you know that as parents you can ring the National registry or go to the web site to check out your child's immunisation status? All you need is your Medicare number. Phone 1800 653 809 or access the web site: <a href="www.humanservices.gov.au">www.humanservices.gov.au</a> or email <a href="mailto:acir@humanservices.gov.au">acir@humanservices.gov.au</a>.

A copy of an overseas immunisation record can provided to the school office, provided that it has been translated into English.

#### **Head Lice**

#### Tips for Preventing Head Lice

- ✓ Check your child's hair regularly for head lice and eggs ('nits'). Use a metal fine tooth 'nit' comb and plenty of hair conditioner applied to the dry hair, to make the task easier and more effective. To help children sit still for this, offer distracting activities, e.g. play a favourite video, provide games, encourage reading, offer a head massage.
- ✓ **Tie long hair back.** Braid long hair and/or put it up if possible.
- ✓ **Consider applying hair gel or mousse.** These do not prevent or repel lice but may help to keep stray hair strands from contact with other heads.
- ✓ Avoid sharing combs or brushes.
- ✓ **Remind your child** to avoid head-to-head contact with other children, e.g. when working at the computer with others, or when playing, or hugging.

If your child has head lice please notify their teacher.
