#### **Dress & Hair Standards**

Santa Clara has traditionally set very high standards, including personal standards of presentation for its students. I am asking for your cooperation and support in maintaining these standards.

No student is permitted to have a colour put into his or her hair. This includes streaks. Boys are required to have short hair above the collar and behind the ears - short back and sides - No mullets. Girls with long hair must have it tied back with ribbons or headbands being in school colours only. Only one earring per ear and only studs or sleepers are permitted in gold or silver. Nail polish is also not permitted to be worn.

#### **Etiquette**

Parents we ask your support by

discussing with your children, etiquette and consideration for others when attending the school toilets. It has been a concern that children are flushing whole toilet rolls down the toilets (boys in particular) or using the toilet rolls as play, thus wetting them and rendering them unusable. This is a very costly exercise which must not continue. I am sure that those involved would not like a call to their parents if caught. At the same time we ask you to remind your child of the importance of washing their hands after visiting the toilet and once again to use the soap provided in appropriate manner. Thank you.

#### **SUPPORTING PROJECT COMPASSION 2015**



Love begins at home. Mother Teresa said, "Love begins at home and is not how much we do, but how much love can be put into action." This year, Caritas Australia is celebrating 50 years of love and compassion for children, women and men worldwide. Every day, Caritas Australia's programs are focussed on addressing the extreme poverty that afflicts marginalised families and communities.

Over the next week, the children were given Project Compassion moneyboxes to take home. Children, women and most men vulnerable to extreme poverty and injustice are rich in the eyes of Jesus, whose life and compassion inspires Caritas Australia. Through effective partnerships in humanitarian relief and development and by transforming hearts and minds in Australian community, Caritas Australia helps to end poverty, promote justice and uphold dignity. All donations make a life-changing difference to marginalised communities around the world. Below are two stories on how your donations assist Caritas Australia help people and communities around the world.





Eric and Margaret ('Ma' for short) live in a rural area of one of the islands in Fiji. They enrolled in a Married Couples Course at the Caritas Australia supported Tutu Rural training centre (Tutu) twenty-five years ago. Using the skills they learnt there, the couple have built a successful family life, and a thriving farm that provides them with a healthy diet and sustainable source of income. "I think we were blessed to be part of the program in Tutu. Tutu opened a new door for us. Without Tutu we wouldn't be where we are now", said Eric.



Life is very tough for people living in Niger. Many live in extreme poverty, often unable to afford or access food and water. In Niger, more than half the children under five years old have experienced malnutrition. A Nutrition Centre in Niger (supported by Caritas Australia) admits over 500 malnourished children every week. When Fati (2 and a half) became malnourished her mother, Mariama, took her to the Centre to receive the food, nutritional supplements and medical care that she needed to recover. Mariama too was able to regain strength, and learn new income-producing skills.


# **Thank You God For Our Ability To Choose what is Right.**
