Dear Parents/Carers, Staff and Students

Parent-Teacher Partnerships

When families are involved in their children's education in positive ways, children can achieve higher grades and test scores, have better attendance at school, demonstrate more positive attitudes and behaviour. The family is critical to student achievement. I know finding time to be part of your child's education is not easy. One of the first questions many parents ask is, "How can I be involved with my child's school when I work full time?" It's a fair question say teachers, but school involvement isn't necessarily restricted to the classroom or even to out-of-hours activities. Involvement could incorporate reading school newsletter, supporting school's values in the home and encouraging students to respect the policies even if you are not in full agreement with them.

Teachers agree that parental involvement can include helping with sporting activities, parent committees, fundraising, classroom assistance, and working bees. Look for opportunities to share knowledge and experience and respect the teacher's professionalism. No matter what support or assistance parents can offer, regardless of whether it's during school hours or out-of-school hours, it's always appreciated.

Ultimately, your child will reap the benefits of your involvement.

ENRICHMENT PROGRAM

Enrichment or extension takes place within the individual classroom setting by the classroom teacher/ Support Teacher. It provides opportunities for accelerated learning and access to new and more challenging concepts or content. Enrichment activities aim to go beyond the core curriculum at a suitable developmental level for the students. They are designed to broaden knowledge, understanding, skills and interests and promote a higher level of thinking. Enrichment may include additional learning area material, supplementary material beyond the normal range of resources or cover class work in more depth

NUMERACY

Santa Clara School continues to explore current practices and work towards enhancing school and classroom structures and programmes that support all students. Classroom and school structures and programmes are explored in practical terms in turn leading to enhanced Numeracy instruction.

LITERACY - READING RECOVERY

We also continue the implementation with the Reading Recovery programme which is a key program for supporting students who are having difficulty achieving early reading and writing independence. The programme focuses primarily on children in Year Two. Mrs Helen Jackson is the Reading Recovery teacher and works at our school daily.

In this way, the welfare agencies focus on their primary objective - to continue a "mission of care" to people in need within the community, and Lifelink raises much needed funds to support their valuable work. LifeLink is a respected and recognised charity through which the Church conducts professional and ethical fundraising appeals, with funds raised directed towards social service provision.

Some of the Agencies include Emmaus Community, Catholic Outreach, Centacare Employment and Training, The Shopfront, Centrecare Inc, IdentityWA and Daydawn Advocacy Service.

On Wednesday, 3 June, the children at Santa Clara will be LINKING-UP for LifeLink Day 2015. Children will be asked to donate a \$2 donation to purchase a template of six links. The children will then colour or make designs on their own six links. On Wednesday, 3 June, each class will LINK-UP their links and it will be determined which class has the longest chain. During the day, all class chains will be joined together to see how long our school chain will be.
