#### PARENT CONCERNS

Parents are welcome to discuss concerns of any kind, at any time. It is more efficient, considerate and convenient to both parents and teachers if an appointment is made, so that full attention can be given to the issue at hand. Please direct all classroom queries to the classroom teacher first. You may wish to discuss further concerns with the Assistant Principals or Principal.

#### **ABSENTEEISM**

Any absenteeism from school is of great concern to us. It is imperative that your child attends school every day for the entire school term. Parents, consider very carefully the impact absence from lessons has on your child's learning. Studies have shown a high correlation between attendance at school and academic success. Students who miss more than 20 days in any school year can be considered to be at an educational risk.

#### **FOOD ALLERGIES**

The number of children with food allergies in Australia is increasing. The most common food allergies are peanuts, tree nuts (walnuts, almonds, cashews, etc), cow's milk, soy, seafood and eggs. Parents of children with food allergies must ensure they have provided all the relevant information to the school, including action plans, to follow in case of a reaction.

To further assist, the canteen has a system for the placing of orders for children with food allergies. Orders for students with food allergies should be clearly identifiable. This measure will alert canteen staff for the need to adopt additional measures in the preparation of such orders.


