#### **RUNNING CLUB AMENDMENTS**

The Santa Clara School 'Running Club' was established by Andrew Boxsell and his legacy now continues in the good hands of Miss Fitzpatrick and teachers. It is a pleasure to see a large number of students of all ages and some staff run/walk the areas of the school, every Monday and Friday.
