#### **Bullying and Harassment Policy**

Santa Clara School has a responsibility to provide an educational environment that promotes the dignity and respect of the person and, aims to eliminate bullying and harassment in all forms. Learning outcomes, physical health, emotional, psychological and spiritual well-being can be adversely affected by bullying and harassment. Santa Clara School recognises that the personal and developmental growth of <u>all</u> children is paramount and must be nurtured according to the Gospel values espoused by Jesus.

Santa Clara School does not tolerate bullying and harassment by students in any form whatsoever.

If you as parents, have any concerns and issues regarding your child/ren in the classroom, you are requested to make an appointment to see the class teacher/Assistant Principal/Principal.

#### **Anaphylaxis**

You would have read the headlines and seen the news stories: food allergies are a growing concern in schools across Australia. Millions of children – children who are perfectly healthy and normal in every other way – must watch every single bite they eat, or risk suffering a severe or even life threatening reaction. In fact, food allergies claim over 200 lives and are responsible for over 30,000 emergency room visits each year. A major health issue such as

this one needs to be taken seriously, and it has always been the policy of our school to make the safety and well-being of our students is our top priority. Several children in this school have food allergies.

As part of our Christian community, Santa Clara School extends support to these children and their families. Each child with this allergy has an Emergency Action Plan, which has been formulated in cooperation with the parents and medical professionals because of the seriousness of the possible reactions.

I thank you for your cooperation in making our school a safe school for all children.

#### **Uniforms, Jewellery, Haircuts**

Thank you parents for taking the time to ensure that your children are attending school looking smart and clean in their school uniforms. Please refer to the Parent Handbook which is available on the school website, for the school policy on uniforms including hair and jewellery. It is vital that parents support the school by following this policy thereby ensuring that their children are wearing the correct uniform and jewellery and have appropriate haircuts.

#### **Bike Helmets**

Bicycle riders travelling on WA roads and paths must wear an approved helmet. The helmet must be of a standard approved by the Director General of the Department of Transport. At present, these only include helmets that comply with AS/NZS 2063:2008—Bicycle helmets. All approved helmets must be sold with a compliance sticker attached.

A child carried in a child carrier seat and the passenger in a trailer being towed by a bicycle must also wear approved helmets. Retention straps of helmets must be fastened at all times.

Parents, I ask that you please ensure your child has an approved bike helmet and they are instructed to wear the helmet when riding their bike at all times.

#### **Head Lice**


Head lice is very common at this time. **EVERYONE** is asked to BE VIGILANT. Head lice is a community problem which means WE ALL NEED TO TAKE RESPONSIBILITY to help eradicate head lice from our school. Children are in close proximity to each other and touching hair helps head lice to move quickly from head to head. Here are a few tips that work:

- Tie ALL hair back firmly in braids if possible, the closer to the head the better.
- Using a gel or hairspray is more effective at not allowing head lice to attach to loose hair.
- CHECK hair regularly at least once per week using the hair conditioning method.
- Children MUST be treated before returning to school if head lice are found.

All that is required is to have your children registered and booked in.



# A Note from the Community Health Nurse

#### Year 6 Health Information

Information leaflets on colour blindness and scoliosis will be distributed to all Year 6 students in Term 4. Please take the time to read the pamphlets and check your child if there are any concerns.

Colour blindness means that a person cannot distinguish some colours or see the colours differently to other people. Very few people who are colour blind are 'blind' to all colours. Commonly, the colours seen differently are greens, yellows, oranges and reds.

Scoliosis: The normal spine has three curves – one in the neck, one in the upper back and one in the lower back. These curves can be seen from the side, but when you look from behind the spine should appear straight. If the spine has a sideways curve, this is scoliosis.
