#### NCCD Data Collection

Just a reminder that staff are checking data for submission to the NCCD (Nationally Consistent Collection of Data) on school students with disability. The NCCD data collection looks at a much broader definition of 'disability' compared to what you are perhaps familiar with. In this context a 'disability' can mean any student that the teacher or school has to provide some form of support, adjustment or intervention to, in order for the student to access and participate in education on a similar basis to their peers.

#### **Sacrament of Confirmation**


