Santa Clara Primary School aspires to provide a challenging and motivating curriculum that builds on students' knowledge and understandings of themselves and the world around them.

Our teachers, staff and students all become actively and passionately engaged in learning. A shared language of learning is evident in all classrooms and effective practices are consistently implemented across the school.

Reading Recovery

Reading Recovery is an early intervention, preventative program which provides intensive, individual help for children having difficulty in reading and writing after their first year of schooling.

Children are taken from where they are at and assisted by trained teachers to make rapid progress so that they can re-join the average levels within their classroom program. Over the years at Santa Clara many students have been fortunate to receive Reading Recovery lessons and they have gone on to achieve success in their reading and writing.

Santa Clara is fortunate to have Mrs Grech a qualified Reading Recovery teacher on staff who works with selected students from year 1 on supplementing their regular class instruction with a 30-minute daily lesson individually designed to meet his or her literacy needs.

In each lesson, Mrs Grech works with the student in reading and writing tasks that aim to develop the effective strategies that are used by independent readers and writers.

Responding to the cold and flu season

Here are three key steps to keep our school happy and healthy. The Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) advise that influenza is increasing

Schools are also reporting higher rates of students affected by influenza.

Advice for school communities to respond to influenza.

Follow these important steps to respond to students affected by influenza at school:

- Encourage parents of students with cold or flu-like symptoms to seek medical attention for their child.
 Common flu-like symptoms include a high fever, a cough, a runny nose, loss of appetite, body aches and feeling extremely weak and tired. Diagnosis should only be made by a medical practitioner.
- Any students with colds or flu-like symptoms should limit contact with others and stay at home until their symptoms have passed.
- If a student becomes ill at school with these symptoms, the family will be contacted to pick up the student.
- Good general hygiene is the best defence against infection. We all need to encourage students to wash their hands properly and regularly. Ask children to cover their nose and mouth when sneezing and coughing.

Uniform

Thank you to all those families who send their children to school wearing the correct school uniform with pride. We are still in winter uniform for this term. One benefit of having a uniform is that it removes one avenue for peer pressure and competition. The expectation is for all students and I ask you to support the school by ensuring your child/ren are wearing the correct school items. Incorrect shoes and the wearing of non-uniform jewellery and hair items seem to be problem areas.

Siblings due to commence Prep in 2020

Confirmation letters have been sent out to parents who have submitted an application to the school and are eligible, to enrol their child for Prep 2020. If you are a current family and you have a child who is due to commence in 2020, and you haven't put an application in to the school for 2020 enrolment, I strongly urge you to do so immediately.


