

GENERAL MAINTENANCE

IMPORTANT – Administration of Schools (AoS)

Catholic Education Western Australia (CEWA) has committed to a new Administration software platform that has been a work in progress for the last couple of years.

As the demands of modern schools increase, the services required to support schools increase faster still. AoS (Admin of Schools) is a comprehensive engine designed to integrate all of these services and unite them in one central management system. Santa Clara School administration staff have been working with staff from CEWA in preparation for the installation of AoS, to replace our current Administration system.

Please be aware that this will occur as of 24 February 2020. There will be several changes such as a new BPAY reference number and SEQTA logins.

This means that you will not receive your statement of fees until some point after this date. We estimate that the new system will be in place by Week 5 and hope to have your fee schedule out to you by then. Please note that it will look different to your existing fee statement but we will endeavour to keep it as similar as possible.

BPAY reference number: When you receive your Fee Statement please take note of your new BPAY reference number. Prior to making any BPAY payments, please update your bank account details to the new BPAY reference number.

SEQTA Engage: We will send Parents/Carers a link to setup their accounts. All families are required to setup their new account within a week of receiving the link in order to access past reports. Please ensure you keep your username and password, in order to use this again at the end of the year. We appreciate your patience during the transition period.

As part of this process, Mrs Suzanne Walker will not be in the office on Monday, 10 February, and as such the school will not be able to process any payments. Our apologies for any inconvenience.

Liturgically, the season of Lent starts in just a few weeks with Ash Wednesday being on Wednesday 26 February. This week our first whole school Mass for the year will be held on Friday 7 February, at 9:00am in the Santa Clara Church. The mass will be hosted by the Year Six Class and I invite all of you who are able, to join us in this celebration.

As usual, we celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation this term. Enrolment forms for students participating in all of our Sacramental celebrations have been sent out already this week. These forms will be collected by a parish representative this Friday 7 February and next Friday, 14 February between 2:30 and 3:30pm. Please do not return these forms to the school as they must go directly to the parish. The Sacrament of Reconciliation will take place on Thursday, 2 April, in the church, commencing from 4:30pm. In addition, there will be a workshop for the children who are participating in the sacrament and their parents on Thursday, 5 March in the school hall, also commencing at 4:30pm.
