#### **Corona**virus Update

While media and public commentary in relation to Coronavirus (COVID-19) continues to raise concerns for many in our community, public health authorities are advising that the current risk remains low in Western Australia.

However, as the health and wellbeing of our students and staff remains our highest priority, we need to remain vigilant to any potential for increased risks and take precautionary measures to ensure the safest possible educational environment for children and young people.

Although this doesn't apply to Santa Clara School, as a result, all school-related international travel is not to proceed until further notice. This advice applies to all students and education sector staff across Western Australia.

As we continue to respond to COVID-19 in our community, please be assured that the Department of Education, Catholic Education Western Australia, and the Association of Independent Schools of Western Australia will continue to respond as a collaborative team to advice from the WA Department of Health and provide updated advice to schools and staff as appropriate. These updates will then be passed on to the community.

As per the directive of our Prime Minister Scott Morrison, students or staff who have returned to Australia from overseas travel MUST isolate themselves for 14 days.

To assist Santa Clara School in our future response planning, particularly as the April school holidays approach, parents are encouraged to inform me of any upcoming international travel plans. Please see Suzanne in the Office to make a time to meet with me.

At this stage, schools are to remain open and run as normal. This means curriculum delivery through our normal practices will continue. At present, we will not be providing online curriculum delivery for students who are staying at home. At Santa Clara we continue to put the children's safety as our number one priority. We will continue to update you with information as it comes to hand.

#### **After School Pick-Up**

Santa Clara School places an enormous amount of effort into child safety. Over the recent weeks, it has been brought to my attention that a number of students are leaving the school grounds unattended as parents are waiting in cars. Some students have also been seen exiting the Parish gate crossing Coolgardie Street unsupervised. I will be informing students over the coming days that they are not to leave the school grounds unless they have a parent or guardian with them. We urge you to use the school kiss and drive or take the time to walk into the school grounds to pick up your children in order to keep them safe. Thank you for your support in keeping Santa Clara students safe.

### FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Greetings Everyone,

On Monday of this week I attended the Catholic Assistant Principal Association Day in the city, a day which had the theme of inspiring Christ-centred leadership. The keynote speaker for the day was a man by the name of Samuel Clear, who spoke to us about his personal journey as an authentic catholic leader. Sam is an amazing character, who was at one stage earmarked to play AFL for Collingwood Football Club. Following an accident, he was forced to reconsider his life plan. Whilst Sam was and still is a practising catholic, he became disillusioned with the lack of unity between the different Christian denominations and he decided to take his own action, in order to bring this to light.

Subsequently, Sam decided that he would undertake a walk around the world to ask Christian's everywhere to pray for unity in Christ. Setting out on the 16<sup>th</sup> of December 2006, Sam Clear walked from the eastern most point of Brazil, through South America, Central America and North America, across Siberia on the Trans-Siberia Railway and on foot again from Moscow to the western most point of Spain, all for the sake of Christian unity. The journey that Sam so briefly described to the Assistant Principal's that were in attendance was arduous, life-threatening, and awe-inspiring, but he also described acts of incredible selflessness, beauty, love and generosity of spirit from ordinary people around the world: people who are incredibly united with God and mankind.

Sam's story hit a note with me and put a few things into perspective. The simple act of prayer is such a powerful tool, and if were to all act with unified purpose as God wants us to, what could we achieve. Especially in light of current events around the world, with the COVID-19 virus and the lack of unity that is currently occurring in regard to shopping practices. Let us as a Christian community provide our Christ-centred leadership to help each other to have enough of what we need and let us share what we have with those in need. Particularly in this Lenten season of giving.

On the subject of Lent, our Project Compassion Collection Boxes have finally arrived and will be sent home this week. Please give generously to those less fortunate in the world who need our help. As Bishop Oscar Romero said, "Aspire, not to have more, but to be more". It's a sentiment that I think Samuel Clear and many of the people he met on his walk around the world, embody.

And though you may not be able


to touch across the empty square,
