Dear Parents & Carers,

Just a Reflection!

As I am currently sitting here in my office on Saturday while our roof is being cleaned and repointed, I am reflecting on some notes from the Aspiring Principals Program I was involved in last year. I feel very privileged to have participated in this program as I was selected by my peers. The program also gave me the confidence to take the next step in my role as an educator, and here I am now, the Principal at SC! The luckiest Principal ever!



I am very inspired by one of the quotes from the program by a guy named Chris Lowney. Lowney has also written a book on leadership based on Pope Francis. It is an excellent read. If any of you would like to borrow it please come and see me.

The main focus of Lowney's work is to walk with humility and he uses this quote in the image.

As this term is nearing its end, I have decided to use this as a reflection of our children here at Santa Clara School. After spending the last few days checking reports, it is evident our children here have many talents that come in many forms. Some children stand out in their class work. Others stand out in the area of Physical Education or the Arts, in music or the visual pieces they create. Some shine in the leadership skills they demonstrate. What these talents reveal is that our children will one day be amazing teachers, writers, artists or quiet achievers. Whatever the future holds their talents will influence them.



Have you ever just stood there at home in awe watching your children and how easily they get things? My own two girls amaze me each and every day. They seem to know what I am thinking before I even speak. On the other hand, when they explain things to me I need them to slow things right down. Corinne tries to tell me this is the difference between males and females! My two girls are so similar and yet so different and boy are they talented (again, something Corinne tells me they get from her!). We all want our children to be the best they can be by encouraging their talents to grow rather than helping them avoid failure. Sometimes, however, it is the failing that allows them to learn!

I get to see amazing things with our staff also each day here at SC. Watching them in class master their craft and participate in various professional conversations as a staff is inspiring. The things they do each day are beyond what I was ever doing in a classroom. Their dedication to our school and your children is truly visible each and everyday. I am sure their talents have evolved over their time teaching and their spirit strengthens our community here at SC. I can assure you your children are in extremely safe hands! They really are an amazing group of people to work with.

FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Greetings Everyone,

It's that time of year when all of us here at school have one thing on our minds. Reports!

For the past few weeks teachers have been busy checking assessments and the data that they have collected to be able to deliver an honest and accurate report on each student. Report writing is an intense and stressful business for teachers, because we want to ensure that we get it right. We want to give the best information that we can to parents about the progress of each child.

The children feel a variety of emotions at this time. Some are nervous about what the teacher will say about them, some excited to find out how well they have been doing. Many like to compare their results with others in their class, or with siblings. Bragging rights become popular when reports go home. Some children, however; can get quite anxious about reports. They get quite stressed thinking about how they have done or what their parents' reaction to their results may be.

Parents can also be anxious around report time as they worry about how their children are doing in class. Sometimes reports can be quite confusing, particularly when the comments written relate to curriculum outcomes rather than being in plain English. Speaking as a parent I know that my wife often wonders what my boys' teachers really mean and she will often ask me to interpret really academic language. At Santa Clara, we try to keep away from too much of that academic stuff in our report comments. This helps you, our parents to get a more realistic picture of how your children are performing at school.

This year, with everything that has happened surrounding COVID-19, the first semester reports will look somewhat different. Rather than an A, B, C, D, E grading, your children will be given 3 descriptor scale. They will be determined to be either; achieving above target, achieving at target, or working towards target. These grades give an indication of what your child is achieving right now and what they have achieved throughout Semester One. It does not mean that this will be their end of year result, especially as all indications are that we will revert back to the usual grading system in Semester Two.

When you read your child's report, please keep an open mind. If your child doesn't seem to be where you think they should be, then be gentle with them. Remember the circumstances that have impacted their education this year and take this into account. And please, if you have any questions, then don't hesitate to contact your child's teacher.




Look how much they have grown!
